Dear Dan:

I was sorry to hear of the misinformation being circulated about you personally by the Fusion Energy Foundation people. To accuse you, whose record of dedication to the nation has been lifelong, of collaboration with communists is so unjustified as to be ludicrous.

My sympathy is even greater because FEF attacked me just as strongly as they are currently attacking you through 1976. At that time, for unexplained reasons, they stopped, and I currently suffer from their ever-increasing admiration of me.
